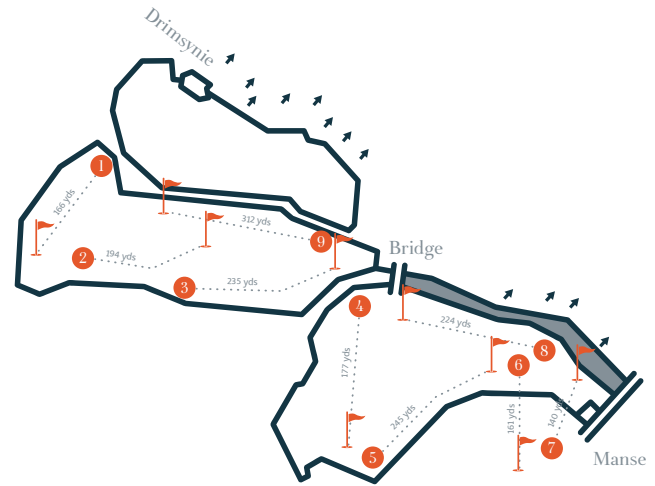


Golf Passport

Fairway Coloured discs on the fairway indicate the distance to the centre of the green.

- Red - 100 yards
- Yellow - 150 yards
- White - 200 yards

Lochgoilhead Golf Course Rules

1. Out of Bounds

A ball is out of bounds if it lies :

- a. Beyond the boundary fences of the course.
- b. Beyond the ditch to the right of the 4th
- c. Within the areas defined with white posts.
- d. Beyond the roads to the right of the 5th/14th and 9th/18th ie. In the River Goil

2. Hazards

Any ditches or areas marked with red posts are hazards. This includes the ditches to the right of 3rd/12th, across the 3rd/12th fairway, to the right of the 4th/13th, to the left and right of the 5th/14th A ball landing in any other irrigation/drainage hollow may be lifted and dropped, not nearer the hole, within 1 club length of the nearest point of relief without penalty.

2. Blue Stakes

Blue stakes, when in play, mark areas of ground under repair. Check notice board before play to see if they are applicable on the day of play.

3. Roads & Paths

A ball landing on the following roads/paths may be lifted and dropped, not nearer the hole, within 1 club length of the nearest point of relief without penalty :

- a. The road to the right of the 5th/14th
- b. The road crossing the 6th/15th and 7th/16th fairways
- c. The road to the right of the 9th/18th
- d. Stone paths near the 4th/13th and 8th/17th greens

4. Overhead Cables and Poles

Balls striking overhead cables or poles may be replayed without penalty. The decision as to whether to replay the shot must be taken from the original position, not at the point the ball comes to rest. If a telegraph pole or supporting wire interferes with a player's stance or swing, the ball may be lifted and dropped, not nearer the hole, within 1 club length of the nearest point of relief without penalty.

5. Staked Trees

If a young tree indicated by a stake interferes with a player's stance or swing, the ball must be lifted and dropped, not nearer the hole, within 1 club length of the nearest point of relief without penalty.

6. Stones in Bunker

Stones in bunkers are defined as movable obstructions (Rule 24-1 applies)

7. Order of Play

- a. Players on the 2nd/11th Medal Tee should wait until players on 3rd/12th have played.
- b. Players on the 7th/16th should wait until players on the 8th/17th Medal Tee have played.
- c. Groups starting their second round (10th hole) should alternate with those groups starting their first round (1st hole).
